Legacy Grants for Student Health

Application Guidelines 2020-2021

Baptist-Trinity Lutheran Legacy Foundation was established in May 2003 with the assets from two former foundations, Baptist Medical Center Foundation and Trinity Lutheran Hospital Foundation. BTLFF's mission is "to provide support in the greater Kansas City area for crisis related medical assistance, neighborhood school health grants and health education programs and services".

Grant Program Overview

BTLFF launched its Legacy Grants for Student Health program in 2017. BTLFF's Health Education Committee completed a needs assessment and a review of health literature, which resulted in and evolved into the selection of three project categories: asthma assessment and treatment, health screening and AED's, and mental health intervention training.

The Committee initially invited six school districts with high free and reduced-price lunch percentage rates to apply, which has now expanded to eleven. In an effort to realign the grant cycle with an academic year, applications will be received for a grant period of Spring 2020-Spring 2021 for a total of \$300,000 in grant funds (future grants will be applied for in the spring semester, starting in spring 2021). Grant applications will be considered in the following categories:

1. Asthma assessment and treatment supplies (e.g. flow meters and spacers)
2. Health screening equipment and Automated External Defibrillators (e.g. audiometers, vision spot screeners, and AED's)
3. Mental health intervention training for faculty, students, administration and health staff.
Examples: Mental Health First Aid; suicide/self-harm prevention, intervention, postvention training; Trauma Informed Care; Anti-bullying training or education.

Application Requirements

Your school district's application materials must be received via email no later than Friday, October 25, 2019. Please send to Tammy Collingsworth at tammy@btlff.org. Your application should include:

- One- to two-page overview of the school district including:
 - Mission statement
 - Organizational profile
 - W-9
 - Student population and demographics
 - Availability and types of health/wellness programs
 - Other information relevant to your district's request
- Letter of support for grant application from Superintendent of Schools
- Three-page project narrative which identifies:
 - Grant category(ies)
 - Need
 - Description of target audience (school districts have the discretion to target specific schools, populations, etc. with appropriate justification)
 - Number of students and faculty to be served
 - Outcomes/Evaluations- Description of measurable tracking concerning impact of grant monies received. Highest consideration given to districts that quantify success through student population affected, or related positive interventions resulting from the educational or actual diagnostic use of grant funds.
 - Budget
 - Name, email and phone number of contact person
- Completed Grant Outcomes Spreadsheet provided with these guidelines.
- Eligibility contingent upon completed reporting on prior grants received.
